Background:

The Outreach Department at the South Florida Wildlife Center offers engaging programs throughout the community to raise awareness about the importance of coexisting with wildlife and preserving animal habitats in South Florida. Wildlife Education Interns at the Center will learn the essentials of educational program design while also caring for a living collection of Ambassador Animals. Interns will enhance their public speaking skills by assisting with various outreach programs and will be responsible for the daily care of resident animals, including meal preparation, cleaning, enrichment activities, training implementation, and completing special projects.

Expected Work Conditions:

The work environment includes both indoor spaces with air conditioning and outdoor conditions characterized by extreme heat, high humidity, and occasional storms. Some tasks may take place in areas with abundant wild plants, so it's important to be aware of any allergies to local flora. Additionally, exposure to mosquitoes and other small insects is likely.

Pre-requisites:

- Previous volunteer experience with animals or at SFWC is preferred.
- Must be 18 or older to be considered for this position.
